Pray and Reflect on the Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven hallowed be Thy name.	What are the signs of God's presence in your life?
Thy kingdom come thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.	What is God asking you to do now?
Give us this day our daily bread.	In what ways does God give you your daily bread?
And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.	For what do you need to ask for forgiveness?
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.	How do you use prayer to help overcome temptation?

Using scripture stories, this session focuses on 4 points.

1. God loves you.

The Story of the Raising of Lazarus John 11: 1-44

Read the account in John's Gospel.

John's Gospel tells us that Jesus travels to a part of Galilee that is dangerous for him. He responds to the great faith that Martha and Mary show him, and he loves Lazarus back to life. Let us become one of the witnesses who grow in trust and love as we know Jesus as loving friend.

2. Turn away from your sins and believe in the Good News.

Jesus often taught in parables. In this treasured parable, Jesus lets us in on the great news that our God, our Father in heaven, is a profoundly generous and forgiving father. A father who runs to meet us when we decide it's finally time to reject a world without him.

My faith in Jesus grows when I know who he is.

3. Believe that Jesus is your Lord and Savior.

For it is in the faith of these disciples that we see our goal. When Jesus asked, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter proclaimed without hesitation, "You are the messiah, the Son of the living God!" (Mt 16:16) Jesus spoke about Peter's faith as coming not through human means but through a revelation from God.

Peter... Matthew... Thomas...Martha...Nicodemus

Zacchaeus... Joseph of Arimathea...Mary Magdalene

Jesus is real and alive. He speaks to you and is actively seeking a relationship with you. Those who make a decision to follow Christ "show" the results of this decision in their lives. They intentionally become part of God's plan.

The Parable of the Sower and the Seed

In this section we are going to examine the different ways people respond when they hear the gospel stories.

In the parable called "The Sower", Jesus tells us the responses available to us. Now we know that Jesus told his disciples to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit..." (Mt. 28:19) So the ultimate response to hearing the good news of Jesus is to go out and tell others.
